The Senate meeting started with an address from the Director IIIT Kota and MNIT[1] Jaipur, the chairperson Senate, Prof.I.K.Bhat. He discussed the challenges ahead for IIIT Kota, which need to be addressed. It was reported that budgetary challenges need to be tackled to handle commitments of major stakeholders viz. Central and State governments.

The coordinator, IIIT Kota, Prof. M.S Gaur apprised the Senate and said that the institute [2]need to get more attention from the industry. Not for profit PPP model Act Of Parliament is taking shape. Once it is formulated other support will start coming. Industrial partners are active with their presence and finances. Road map and vision document need to be prepared. There is a need of a full-time Director and Chairman. It was also informed that the orientation program that was introduced at the I year on the lines of IIT Gandhinagar was very successful.

The Senate [7]discussed and agreed to change the name of the program since it was more acceptable[8]. However, an opinion from the existing students shall be taken. Senate authorized Chairman Senate to approve the same and report in the next meeting the due change.
1-4.1	Proposal to start M.Tech dual degree program. In the sixth semester, the students with CGPA > 8 may be given a choice of converting the four years B.Tech program to 5-year M.Tech dual degree program. The proposal is to allow a Maximum of 10% students from B.Tech maintaining shall be permitted to convert for M.Tech after due counseling by DUGC and DPGC.	Senate discussed this item at length. The proposal was agreed with the removal of any limit on the conversion. Also, this program shall be launched only if the PG regulation is in place, and necessary guidelines are framed. Prof. J.P Mishra suggested that a student after completing his UG should be allowed to pursue Ph.D. directly on the lines of practice at other [9] institutes. Mr. Narendra Sharma asked what extra is to be included in M.Tech dual degree, and this program will lead to increasing in student to teacher ratio.  Dr .Sanghi said that at IIT Kanpur companies prefer students from dual degree program as compared to B.Tech because M.Tech students are teaching associates for 1 <sup>st</sup> /2 <sup>nd</sup> year that brings more maturity in them. However, GATE score is not mandatory for IIT/NIT and IIIT candidates whose CGPA is >8. Mid sem feedback is taken where the students write what is right or wrong about the course and faculty. The faculty gives the answer to it. The students are then asked if they experienced any change due to the feedback. The teacher prepares the course completion report. This report is sent to outside institution. The report is used at the time of promotion. Mr. Narendra Sharma suggested that there should be a mentor for the faculty who would interpret the feedback and help the faculty. The faculty should trigger the students to ask questions. Prof.M.S Gaur will sit with Prof. Dheeraj Sanghi and formulate a mechanism for feedback system on IIT Kanpur and IIIT Delhi model. [27][28]
